NOW, THEREFORE, WITH THE CONSENT AND CONCURRENCE OF THE BANKRUPTCY JUDGES, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Stephanie James Edmondson is hereby appointed Acting Clerk of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina, effective January 3, 2009.
2. The Acting Clerk is authorized to exercise all the rights, privileges, obligations and responsibilities of the Office of Clerk of Court pursuant to 28 U. S. C. 156(b) and as otherwise provided by law, effective January 3, 2009.
3. That copies of this order shall be served on the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, the Office of Circuit Executive of the Fourth Circuit, and shall be posted on the official website of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina at [www.nceb.uscourts.gov](http://www.nceb.uscourts.gov).
