For the debtor listed above, a case has been filed under chapter 7 of the Bankruptcy Code. An order for relief has been entered. This notice has important information about the case for creditors, debtors, and trustees, including information about the meeting of creditors and deadlines. Read both pages carefully.

The filing of the case imposed an automatic stay against most collection activities. This means that creditors generally may not take action to collect debts from the debtor or the debtor's property. For example, while the stay is in effect, creditors cannot sue, assert a deficiency, repossess property, or otherwise try to collect from the debtor. Creditors cannot demand repayment from debtors by mail, phone, or otherwise. Creditors who violate the stay can be required to pay actual and punitive damages and attorney's fees.

To protect your rights, consult an attorney. All documents filed in the case may be inspected at the bankruptcy clerk's office at the address listed below or through PACER (Public Access to Court Electronic Records at www.pacer.gov).

Deadlines The bankruptcy clerk's office must receive proofs of claim by the following deadlines.</p> <p>** All claims filed before conversion of the case to a Ch. 7 are deemed filed in the Ch. 7 case and duplicate or additional claims need not be filed. **</p> <p>See Fed. R. Bank P. 1019(3).</p>	<p>Deadline for all creditors to file a proof of claim 10/6/20 (except governmental units):</p> <p>Deadline for governmental units to file a proof of claim: 11/16/20</p> <p>A proof of claim is a signed statement describing a creditor's claim. A proof of claim may be filed online at www.nceb.uscourts.gov by accessing the Proof of Claim section. Alternatively, a proof of claim form may be obtained from the same website and submitted by mail. <i>When filing electronically, it is not necessary to complete a paper claim form.</i> If you do not file a proof of claim by the deadline, you might not be paid on your claim. To be paid, you must file a proof of claim even if your claim is listed in the schedules that the debtor filed.</p> <p>Secured creditors retain rights in their collateral regardless of whether they file a proof of claim. Filing a proof of claim submits the creditor to the jurisdiction of the bankruptcy court, with consequences a lawyer can explain. For example, a secured creditor who files a proof of claim may surrender important nonmonetary rights, including the right to a jury trial.</p>
<p>9. Creditors with a foreign address</p>	<p>If you are a creditor receiving a notice mailed to a foreign address, you may file a motion asking the court to extend the deadlines in this notice. Consult an attorney familiar with United States bankruptcy law if you have any questions about your rights in this case.</p>
<p>10. Electronic noticing</p>	<p>Parties may opt to receive notices from the court via email rather than U.S. Mail. Register at https://bankruptcynotices.uscourts.gov.</p>
<p>11. Liquidation of the debtor's property and payment of creditors' claims</p>	<p>The bankruptcy trustee listed on the front of this notice will collect and sell the debtor's property. If the trustee can collect enough money, creditors may be paid some or all of the debts owed to them, in the order specified by the Bankruptcy Code. To ensure you receive any share of that money, you must file a proof of claim, as described above.</p>
